Public Financial Management (PFM) Committee

Resolution No. 03-2014

WHEREAS, the Public Financial Management (PFM) Committee was created under Executive Order No. 55 dated September 6, 2011 to carry out activities for the development and implementation of government-wide policy and system reforms on PFM, including the capacity development of the PFM workforce;

WHEREAS, the PFM Certificate Program is envisioned as an important strategy to build the PFM knowledge and skills of government personnel tasked to put into practice and sustain the broader set of reforms carried out under the PFM Reform Program;

WHEREAS, the Program is envisioned to help increase staff competencies by providing systematic, continuing, competency-based training and learning program for PFM staff at all levels – from new recruits to executives, and to contribute to improvements in individual and organizational performance and desirable behaviors in the workplace.

WHEREAS, with support from the Government of Australia - Public Financial Management Program (PFMP), the first phase of the activity was completed in January 2014 providing the Government with the *PFM Competency Frameworks*, and the second phase will commence in November 2014 to develop the *PFM Curriculum and Budgeting and Performance Track* for piloting in July 2015;

WHEREAS, an inter-agency body is needed to provide broad policy directions and guidelines in the development and implementation of the PFM Certificate Program, composed of following:

RESOLVED, that the Program Steering Committee shall act as the policy oversight for the PFM Certificate Program implementation and will have the following functions:


1. Set the guiding principles and policies to govern the development and implementation of the PFM Certificate Program;
2. Ensure that Program policies and strategies are aligned with the PFM Reform Program and Government policy objectives on human resource development, position classification and qualifications, and performance management adopted through the Civil Service Commission and the Department of Budget and Management;
3. Ensure that the government resources and institutional arrangements necessary to support the agreed Program delivery model are put in place;
4. Constitute a management team and working groups, as necessary, to implement and oversee the day-to-day activities under the Program including those of service providers, as applicable; and
5. Provide policy advice to the PFM Committee on matters pertaining to the implementation of the PFM Certificate Program.


RESOLVED FURTHER, that the PFM Certificate Program Steering Committee will report to the PFM Committee on the status of PFM Certificate Program implementation to ensure synchronization of efforts with other PFM initiatives.
